Dear Colleagues:

The 56th Annual Meeting of the SGI in Glasgow (UK), will be an historical event. It will be the first time that the SGI Annual Scientific Meeting takes place outside North America. This follows the process of internationalization promoted by SGI in the new millennium. The theme of the 2009 meeting is "Science and Women's Health: The Impact of Genes, Hormones and Environment".

Sarah Berga and John Challis and the Scientific Program Committee are working hard to make this our best meeting ever!!

The program will include three major plenary lecturers (the SGI President's Lectureship, C.D. Christian Lecturer and the President's International Lectureship. Professor Wylie Vale (Salk Institute), Professor Sir Ian Wilmut FRS (University of Edinburgh) and Professor Stephen O'Rahilly, FRS (Cambridge University, UK) have already graciously accepted our invitations to participate in the 56th annual meeting. In addition, we plan a series of Mini-Symposia, Debates, Meet the Expert and a new innovation of late Breaking Working order to present up to the moment information in basic and translational science and information. We plan space for 180 oral communications and for more than 600 posters.

The annual meeting will be preceded by a day of special satellite symposia including ones on the placenta (with the European placenta group), myometrium (with the European preterm labor group), ovary (in conjunction with ESHRE), DOHaD and advances in ultrasound technology (Esoate). Each satellite meeting will include 6 to 8 major review lectures on key topics in Obstetrics and Gynecology.

Glasgow is one of Europe's most exciting, safe and beautiful destinations. It combines the energy and sophistication of a great international city with some of Scotland's most spectacular scenery. Please read the instructions carefully when preparing your abstract. Authors will be responsible for proof-reading their abstracts and conforming to all requirements. To support scientific exchange at regional and international meetings, and societies whose meetings are not attended primarily by Obstetrician-Gynecologists, the Council of the Society for Gynecologic Investigation has agreed that the Society will permit the presentation of abstracts that have been previously presented at either regional meetings, international meetings, or meetings of alternative societies which do not primarily include Obstetrician-Gynecologists. **These abstracts may have been published in the program of the meeting, but should not have appeared in peer-reviewed journals.** When submitting an abstract which has been presented at another meeting, the author should note on the abstract submission form where the abstract has previously been presented.

The electronic abstract submission deadline is Tuesday, October 21, 2008, 11:59 p.m., Central Standard Time. The SGI requires that material accepted for oral presentation or poster is personally presented by the indicated Author, who is required to register for the Meeting.
